GENERAL POLICE ORDER

	OVING DRUG EVIDENCE FROM THE FO	DRENSIC UNIT	,

PURPOSE: To ensure accountability for controlled substances removed from the Forensic Unit.

POLICY: It is the policy of the Cleveland Division of Police to regulate the removal of drug evidence from the Forensic Unit to maintain accountability.

PROCEDURES:

- I. Removing Drug Evidence for Court
 - A. Officers shall not remove drug evidence from the Forensic Unit without authorization.
 - B. Officers may receive authorization from a prosecutor to remove drug evidence from the Forensic Unit for court-related purposes in the following circumstances:
 - 1. The drug evidence is for a pending pretrial hearing or a trial, and the City or county prosecutor assigned to the case gives the officer a verbal or written request to present the evidence.
 - 2. A written request is on the officer's subpoena that drug evidence is needed at the court appearance.
 - C. The Forensic Unit shall:
 - 1. Update the chain of custody in LERMS from the Forensic Unit to the receiving officer.
 - 2. Complete a paper copy with the receiving officer's signature.
 - 3. Retain the signed document in the evidence release files until the evidence is returned.
 - D. In instances where an officer is no longer needed but drug evidence is requested to remain in the courtroom by the prosecutor, officers shall not relinquish custody without completing the following:
 - 1. The prosecutor assuming custody of the drug evidence shall send an email to the officer containing:

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- a. The prosecutor's full name, contact information, and the evidence they are taking custody of.
- b. The email shall be received reviewed by the officer <u>before</u> leaving court and relinquishing custody.
- 2. The officer shall make a LERMS chain of custody entry to document to whom the evidence was transferred.

III. Returning Drug Evidence

- A. The Forensic Unit shall:
 - 1. *Update the evidence release files when the drugs are returned.*
 - 2. Inspect the drugs returned.
 - a. The inspection shall include an examination of the original packaging, the contents, and recorded quantities.
 - b. Discrepancies in the above shall be noted and forwarded *through the chain of command to the Internal Affairs Unit* for further investigation.
- B. Drug evidence being returned from court after Forensic Unit hours shall be secured at the member's district/unit.

THIS ORDER SUPERSEDES ANY PREVIOUSLY ISSUED DIRECTIVE OR POLICY FOR THIS SUBJECT AND WILL REMAIN EFFECTIVE UNTIL RESCINDED OR SUPERSEDED.
