At a status conference on January 6, 2017, the Court provided the City of Cleveland with time to present additional information to the United States and Monitor relating to officer use of body-worn camera technology during secondary employment. *See* Dkt. 101. The Parties and Monitoring Team subsequently “engaged in useful and collaborative discussions about these issues.” Dkt. 107 (extending deadline); *see* Dkt. 116 (same).

The Parties and Monitoring Team have now reached an agreement in principle to construct and implement a pilot program for the use of body-worn cameras during secondary employment work. A detailed, written project plan for that pilot program will be provided to the Court not later than April 28, 2017, and deadlines related to the pilot program will be included in the forthcoming Second-Year Monitoring Plan.
