Fraudulent Companies Promoting Free Medicine

Be cautious of companies that solicit you for free medication. Many pharmaceutical companies have promotions on their products, and this information will be provided to you free of cost. A second party is never required to qualify you for free medication. Sometimes your pharmacist or physician will have coupons, or promotional trial sizes of medication to give away for free. If any nonprofit organizations call and ask for personal information, or payment to assist you in acquiring free medication, contact the Internal Revenue Services to verify if they are registered as a nonprofit organization before disclosing any personal identification information.
