## **Pipeline Infrastructure Improvements Update**

**Monday, February 19, 2018**

**Dominion Energy Ohio Gas Pipeline Infrastructure Replacement Project – PIR 626**  
**West 3rd Street and Stones Levee**  
**(City of Cleveland Ward 3)**

**Expect additional traffic notices as work progresses**

**CLEVELAND** – On Monday, February 19, 2018, Dominion Energy Ohio will begin a gas pipeline infrastructure improvement project which includes work on the following streets:

- Stones Levee – From West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street westerly approximately 500’.
- West 4<sup>th</sup> Street – From Central Avenue to Harrison Avenue.
- Harrison Avenue – From West 4<sup>th</sup> Street to West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street.
- West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street – From Harrison Avenue to Canal Road.

The project scope is to replace the old steel mainline with new plastic mainline in the sidewalk area. A minimum of one lane of traffic will be maintained at all times on West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street. Traffic control personnel will be present in the work zone directing traffic. Access to adjacent driveways will be maintained throughout construction. The work will take place Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

This project is scheduled for completion by the end of April 2018. Temporary, 2” thick sidewalk will be installed until permanent sidewalk can be installed in the spring. Final grading and landscaping will immediately follow permanent sidewalk installation.
