North and South Marginal Road Improvements

Traffic Advisory

West Boulevard to Lorain Road

Wednesday, June 13, 2018

(City of Cleveland Ward 15)

CLEVELAND – On Wednesday, June 13, 2018, the City will begin the next phase of road improvements along the North and South Marginal Roads.

On Western Boulevard, from West Boulevard to West 100th Street, traffic will be shifted to the south side of the pavement, and both eastbound and westbound traffic will be maintained. On Western Boulevard and North Marginal Road, from West 100th Street to Lorain Road, traffic will be shifted to the south side of the pavement and one lane will be maintained in the westbound direction. From North Marginal Road, the intersection of West 93rd Street will be closed, and at West 95th Street the northbound lane only will be closed.

Crews will be working on the north side of Marginal Road and Western Boulevard, from West Boulevard to Lorain Road, to repair and/or replace damaged pavement, curbs, and sidewalk. This phase is expected to be completed in four weeks. This rehabilitation project will provide improvements along the 1 mile road, including Western Boulevard, North and South Marginal Roads, and West 98th Street.

Work will include full and partial-depth pavement repair and asphalt resurfacing; concrete pavement replacement; concrete curb and sidewalk repairs; new curb ramps and drive aprons; added green space and storm water quality features; and new pavement markings which include bicycle friendly features. The work will take place during daytime hours from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.
